Our playground is zoned into active areas for all children to explore through team building, problem solving, creative thinking and building resilience. We are really proud of our unique outdoor opportunities that allow child initiated learning to continue right through to y6 and ensure that children are learning in every part of their day. We have a GoKart track, den building, loose parts, forest school play area, nature centre, reading and writing sheds, as well as lots of sporting activities. Our y6 leaders lead clubs for younger children in the school at lunchtimes such as 'karaoke club', 'stone painting club' and many more. Our rainforest room is a well being centre for pupils who wish to have a quieter lunchtime and is open for all year groups and run by our wellbeing ambassadors. All children mix together from all our age groups and this has amazing opportunities for developing citizenship and nurturing relationships for every age group.
